Dutch Air Force C-47 Memorial

On 7th September 1944, a Royal Netherlands East Indies Air Force C-47 Dakota with 20 persons on board went missing and subsequently crashed near Mossman. It was on a flight from Merauke to Cairns. There were no survivors. Among the 20 persons on board were 2 Australians, SQNLDR Leslie "Smokey" Dawson (RAAF) and Lt Horace Armstrong (AIF)

It was initially thought that the aircraft may have gone down in the Trinity Beach area. The wreckage was eventually found in January 1989 by an Australian/New Zealand scientific expedition NW of Mossman.

On 21st January 989 FLGOFF Pat Kenny (RAAF Museum Curator), WOFF Brucr Hurst aided by a member of the Aus/NZ Team were winched down near the wreck and were able to confirm that the wreck was indeed that of the Dutch Dakota.

The recovery was approved on 24th January and the operation started on 5th February. Personnel from 27 SQN RAAF supported by a UH-1H Iroquois from 35 SQN were tasked with the recovery. This operation was completed on 10th February. The remains of those killed were recovered and intered at the Cairns War Cemetery.

On 7th September 2019, Branch Historian, Bruce Hurst, attended a small gathering at the Mossman memorial and addressed those who attended with a history of the crash.







SOCIAL FUNCTION



A SHORT STORY (by Basil Nelson). . . .

It was one of those marginal weather nights with some low cloud and passing rain showers. As the ATC on night duty in the tower I was preparing for the arrival of the evening "jets" from Brisbane. To try and keep noise to a minimum, larger aircraft arriving from the south-east were positioned to track east of the city then over water until on final for Runway 19 (landing into the south). On this September night the cloud was such that a landing on RWY19 might put the aircraft into cloud over the island. I could see the lights on the TV towers on Mt Stuart so I processed the aircraft to land on RWY01 (landing into the north) via a Right Base (over Laverack).

The arrival of the first jet was uneventful. The second jet followed the same route and landed safely. As the aircraft taxied along the parallel taxiway to the terminal the captain got my attention when he transmitted "Tower, are you aware that there is someone walking along the taxiway?" The murder of 11 Israeli athletes at the 1972 Summer Olympics by the Black September group had recently occurred and we were ordered to be vigilant identifying any unusual occurrence that could be terrorism related. Well I thought this may fit the bill so I called down to the firies and the Tactical Rescue was dispatched with the Shift SNCO, CPL and an LAC on board.

In the glare of the headlights a sole male was spotted weaving his way along the taxiway. The vehicle stopped, the male was instructed to get in. He started to comply then propped - "You'll put me in jail" he said just as one of the firies hopped off the vehicle brandishing the section shotgun. In a flash the culprit rushed to the vehicle and jumped aboard.

Enroute to the Service Police at the front gate, the following info was obtained:

- 1. He was drunk.
- 2. He was with his mates (3 guys) in a car looking to pick up girls.
- 3. They had a case of beer in the car.
- 4. They picked up 2 girls and drove to the Town Common.
- 5. They kicked him out (1 too many blokes), kept his beer and told him to get lost.
- 6. He saw lights on a road (the RWY), got over the 4 strand barbed wire fence and crossed the road.
- 7. As he was walking up this other road (TWY) along came this BIG truck (the jet).

It was a huge relief that we weren't being attacked but I still made sure that the door to the tower was locked after that.
