RAAF Townsville September 1945 (75 years on)

08 September 1945 USAAF Mitchell B-25M aircraft 43-4913 (JACKNIC SNR), departed Townsville for Biak via north coast Australia (LNP 19deg 15' S 146deg 46'E) -no further news.

18 September 1945 RAAF 38 Squadron Dakota A65-61 (VH-CUT) failed to arrive Townsville from Biak –no trace found during searches in New Guinea- not likely to have reached Australian mainland.

On 16 October 1968 an American Missionary, Jerry Reeder spotted aircraft wreckage while flying his aircraft at 14,000 ft across the Nassau Range in West Irian Jaya. The wreckage was on the side of Mount Carstens.

Reeder returned in mid 1970 in a Bell Ranger helicopter and identified the crashed aircraft as VH-CUT.

On 03 December 1970 the Australian military implemented Operation "Tropic Snow" to recover the 29 remains of those killed in this tragic crash.

The remains were buried in the Bomana Port Moresby War Cemetery with full military honors on the 26 January 1971. The Pacific Island Regiment together with Pipes and Drums took part in the moving ceremony, attended by service representatives and families of the deceased.
